

Dear friend,

Anchored in the Word is a resource to help you read the Bible more consistently and fruitfully. Following this guide will lead you to read thoughtfully through the entire Bible over the course of three years. There are selections to read five days per week. One day per week is devoted to the New Testament, three to the Old, and one to the Psalms.

For each day of the quarter this guide includes a passage to read, a one sentence summary of the day's reading, and a question to help you notice the text. The guide is divided by weeks with a blank page to take notes each week. As you consider the provided questions, think carefully about how the truths in these passages apply to your life.

- What does this teach me about God? Reflect on what the passage reveals about God's character, will, and ways.
- How can I apply this to my life? Think about practical ways the passage's teachings can be lived out in your daily life.
- Is there a command to obey or an example to follow? Look for direct instructions or examples set by biblical figures.
- What does this teach me about human nature or the world?
 Consider insights the passage offers about humanity and the world around you.
- Is there a promise to claim? Identify promises in the passage and reflect on their relevance to your life.
- How does this passage challenge or encourage me?
- What prayer points emerge from this reading? Use insights from the passage to guide your prayer life.
- How can I share this with others? Think about ways to discuss or demonstrate the lessons learned with those around you.

Remember to pray before, during and in response to reading. May God bless you as you read His Word! The goal is to let the Scripture speak into your life, guiding and transforming you according to its truth.

VERSE OF THE WEEK

Make sure that your way of life is free from the love of money, being content with what you have; for He Himself has said, "I will never desert you, nor will I ever forsake you," (Hebrews 13:5)

God disciplines us as His children, encourages us to live holy lives, and offers practical advice for Christian conduct.

Instructions for making the altar of incense, the census tax, the bronze basin, the anointing oil, and the incense are given.

Why do you think specific instructions were given for these items, and how might they enhance worship?

☐ EXODUS 31-32

God appoints skilled workers for the tabernacle; Israel makes the golden calf, leading to Moses' intercession and God's punishment.

What can we learn about leadership and accountability from the events surrounding the golden calf?

☐ EXODUS 33:1-34:9

God commands Israel to continue to the Land, Moses intercedes for the people, and God reveals His glory & renews the covenant.

What does Moses' intercession teach us about the role of a mediator between God and His people?

☐ **PSALM 106:1-14**

Praise for God's enduring love, recounting Israel's rebellion and God's continued mercy and salvation.

What insights can we gain about human nature and divine patience from Israel's repeated disobedience and God's mercy?

COLOSSIANS 1-2

Paul emphasizes Christ's supremacy, our reconciliation through Him, and warns against deceptive philosophies.

EXODUS 34:10-35:19

God renews His covenant with Israel, giving laws about worship and work, and instructs the construction of the tabernacle.

What is the significance of God renewing His covenant and the detailed instructions for worship?

EXODUS 35:20-36:38

The Israelites willingly bring offerings for the tabernacle, and skilled

What motivates the Israelites to contribute so generously, and what can we learn from their example?

craftsmen begin the work as instructed by God.

☐ EXODUS 37:1-38:7

Bezalel makes the ark, the table, the lampstand, the altar of incense, and the altar of burnt offering according to God's instructions.

How do the detailed craftsmanship and materials used for the tabernacle items reflect the importance of worship?


☐ PSALM 106:15-29

VERSE OF THE WEEK

☐ LUKE 2:15-3:20

Shepherds visit Jesus, Jesus is presented at the temple, and John the Baptist begins his ministry, calling for repentance.

How do the responses of the shepherds and John the Baptist's message illustrate the significance of Jesus' arrival?

☐ **LEVITICUS 12:1-13:46**

Instructions are given for purification after childbirth and diagnosing skin diseases, emphasizing ritual cleanliness and health.

What is the significance of the purification rituals and procedures for diagnosing skin diseases in maintaining health & holiness?

☐ LEVITICUS 13:47-14:32

Regulations are provided for dealing with contaminated clothing and the purification of those healed from skin diseases.

How do these regulations underscore the importance of cleanliness and the process of restoration in the community?

Laws about cleansing houses with mold and regulations for bodily discharges highlight the need for purity and health.

VERSE OF THE WEEK

□ LUKE 3:21-4:44

Jesus is baptized, tempted in the wilderness, begins His ministry, and demonstrates His authority through teaching and miracles.

What significance do Jesus' baptism, temptation, and early ministry activities hold in revealing His identity and mission?

☐ LEVITICUS 16

Detailed instructions are given for the Day of Atonement, when the high priest makes atonement for the sins of Israel.

Why is the Day of Atonement central to Israel's worship, and what does it symbolize about sin and forgiveness?

☐ LEVITICUS 17-18

God gives laws regarding the sanctity of blood and regulations on sexual conduct to maintain Israel's holiness.

What do these laws reveal about the importance of moral purity in the life of God's people?

☐ LEVITICUS 19

God commands the Israelites to be holy, providing various laws that cover social justice, worship, and daily conduct.

How do the diverse laws in this chapter demonstrate the comprehensive nature of holiness in Israel's life?


☐ PSALM 31

Jesus teaches about love, mercy, and the Sabbath, and selects His apostles, challenging societal norms and religious practices.

☐ **LEVITICUS 24:1-25:17**

God gives laws about the lampstand, the bread of the Presence, blasphemy, and the Sabbath year and Jubilee.

What is the significance of the Sabbath year and Jubilee in promoting social and economic justice?

☐ LEVITICUS 25:18-55

Further details are provided about the Jubilee, including the redemption of property and the treatment of servants.

How does the Jubilee year reflect God's concern for equity and restoration within the community?

☐ LEVITICUS 26

Blessings for obedience and curses for disobedience are outlined, emphasizing the covenant relationship between God and Israel.

What do the promised blessings and curses reveal about the consequences of Israel's faithfulness or unfaithfulness to God?


□ PSALM 145

Week 36 (September 2-6)



Behold, how good and how pleasant it is for brothers to dwell together in unity! (Psalm 133:1)

☐ LUKE 7

How do the miracles and interactions in this chapter illustrate Jesus' power and mercy towards those in need?

☐ LEVITICUS 27

God provides instructions for making vows, dedicating people, animals, and property, and their redemption values.

What is the significance of making vows and dedicating things to God, and how does this practice reflect one's commitment?

□ NUMBERS 1

God commands a census of Israel's warriors, listing the tribes and their numbers to organize the nation for the journey ahead.

What does the census reveal about the organization and preparedness of Israel as they prepare to enter the Promised Land?

☐ NUMBERS 2

God instructs the arrangement of the Israelite camp around the tabernacle, specifying the positions of each tribe.

How does the arrangement of the camp around the tabernacle emphasize the centrality of God's presence among His people?

□ PSALM 133-134

Psalm 133 celebrates the unity of God's people, while Psalm 134 calls for blessings upon those who serve in the house of the Lord.

How do the parables and miracles in this chapter reveal different aspects of Jesus' power and kingdom?

□ NUMBERS 3

God assigns the duties of the Levites, listing their clans and responsibilities in the service of the tabernacle.

What does the detailed organization of the Levites' roles indicate about the importance of orderly worship and service?

□ NUMBERS 4

Instructions are given for the Levite clans regarding the transport of the tabernacle and its furnishings during the journey.

How do the specific tasks assigned to each Levite clan ensure the proper handling and reverence for the tabernacle?

□ NUMBERS 5-6

God provides laws for maintaining purity in the camp, including the test for adultery, restitution, and the Nazirite vow.

What is the purpose of the Nazirite vow, and what does it signify about personal dedication to God?

☐ **PSALM 119:97-112**

The psalmist expresses love for God's law, finding wisdom, guidance, and joy in following His commandments.

Week 38 (September 16-20)

VERSE OF THE WEEK
And He said to them, "But who do you say that I am?" And Peter answered and said, "The Christ of God." (Luke 9:20)
□ LUKE 9:1-36
Jesus sends out the twelve apostles, feeds the five thousand, predicts His death, and is transfigured, revealing His glory and mission.
How do these events demonstrate both the power and the purpose of Jesus' ministry?
□ NUMBERS 7:1–37
The leaders of Israel bring offerings for the dedication of the altar, detailing the gifts from each tribe.
What is the significance of the leaders' offerings, and how do they reflect the unity and devotion of the tribes?
□ NUMBERS 7:38-89
The chapter continues listing the offerings brought by the leaders for the dedication of the altar, emphasizing their contributions.
How does the detailed account of offerings underscore the importance of collective worship and dedication to God?
□ NUMBERS 8-9
Instructions are given for the consecration of the Levites and the observance of Passover.

Week 39 (September 23-27)

VERSE OF THE WEEK

And He was saying to them, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; therefore pray earnestly to the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into His harvest." (Luke 10:2)

□ LUKE 9:37-10:16

Jesus heals a boy with an unclean spirit, predicts His death, teaches about greatness, and sends out seventy-two disciples.

How do the healing, teachings, and mission of the seventy-two disciples reveal Jesus' authority and the nature of discipleship?

□ NUMBERS 10

God instructs Moses on making two silver trumpets for directing the community, and the Israelites begin their journey from Sinai.

What role do the silver trumpets play in guiding the Israelites, and how do they facilitate communication and order?

☐ NUMBERS 11

The Israelites complain about their hardships and lack of meat, leading God to provide quail and appoint seventy elders to help Moses.

What does the response of the Israelites and God's provision reveal about the challenges of leadership and God's care?

□ NUMBERS 12-13

Miriam & Aaron oppose Moses and are disciplined by God; spies are sent, reporting both the land's abundance & its formidable inhabitants.

What lessons can be learned from Miriam and Aaron's challenge to Moses' authority and the report of the spies?

□ PSALM 98

A psalm of praise celebrating God's marvelous deeds, His salvation, and His righteous judgment of the world.

How do God's works and His call to worship highlight the reasons for rejoicing in God's salvation and justice?

NOTES
